Use of Emmanuel Baptist Church for mid-week baby and expectant mums support group	Covid-19 entering the premises and potentially infecting users of the building	If Covid-19 is contracted visitors, staff or volunteers could become ill	Volunteers/Staff/Adult Visitors (Children)	Medium(Children are Low)	Yes	Comply with government guidelines on self-isolation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ask everyone symptomatic not to attend.</li> <li>Communicate to all that they must stay at home and self-isolate if they have a new, continuous cough or a high temperature or loss of or change to sense of smell or taste. This is to minimise risk of spread of COVID-19 to friends, the wider community, and particularly the vulnerable.</li> </ul>	Jan-21
Use of Emmanuel Baptist Church for mid-week baby and expectant mums support group	Covid-19 entering the premises and potentially infecting users of the building	If Covid-19 is contracted visitors, staff or volunteers could become ill	Volunteers/Staff/Adult Visitors (Children)	Medium(Children are Low)	Yes	Comply with the social distancing guidelines set out by the government (2m, or 1m with risk mitigation where 2m is not viable).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ask everyone over 18 years old to comply with social distancing on Emmanuel's premises via appropriate signage. Under 5s are not expected to social distance.</li> <li>Set chairs out in a 2m socially distanced seating arrangement.</li> <li>Ask families/individuals to enter the building using 2m social distancing and queueing if necessary; volunteers will monitor social distancing as people arrive at church.</li> <li>Keep the support group length to one hour plus 10 minute staggered arrival and 10 minute staggered exit.</li> <li>No food or drinks will be served.</li> <li>Session attendees enter the church building via the Main Entrance and walk through to the Side Hall, after the session attendees exit the Side Hall, walk down th corridor and exit the church building via the Main Entrance.</li> </ul>	Jan-21

Visitors will be encouraged to bring their own toys. If toys are used each family will be allocated their own which will be quarantined after use.</li> <li>Ask people to pre-book for each session in advance via Eventbrite (Open 6am Friday and close by Monday 11pm prior to the session).</li> <li>Ask volunteers to direct visitors to their seat in the Side Hall.</li> </ul>	Jan-21

Use of Emmanuel Baptist Church for mid-week baby and expectant mums support group	Covid-19 entering the premises and potentially infecting users of the building	If Covid-19 is contracted visitors, staff or volunteers could become ill	Volunteers/Staff/Adult Visitors (Children)	Medium(Children are Low risk)	Yes	Facilitate good hygiene by promoting frequent and thorough handwashing/hand cleaning with gel.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide antibacterial soap in all toilet facilities.</li> <li>• Provide signage to encourage regular handwashing around building.</li> <li>• Provide signage detailing best '20 second' handwashing practice in toilet facilities.</li> <li>• Provide all toilet facilities with 60% alcohol antibacterial gel dispensers.</li> <li>• Provide 60% alcohol hand gel at both entrances to site with signage instructing all visitors to clean hands before entering building.</li> <li>• Volunteers will wear disposable gloves when moving or carrying chairs and other equipment around the building.</li> </ul>	Jan-21
Use of Emmanuel Baptist Church for mid-week baby and expectant mums support group	Covid-19 entering the premises and potentially infecting users of the building	If Covid-19 is contracted visitors, staff or volunteers could become ill	Volunteers/Staff/Adult Visitors (Children)	Medium(Children are Low risk)	Yes	Facilitate good hygiene generally and especially in respect of toilet facility use and cleaning.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Using signs and posters to build awareness of the need to avoid touching your face and to cough or sneeze into a tissue which is binned safely.</li> <li>• Provide 60% alcohol hand gel in washrooms - ask users to gel hands before using toilet facilities.</li> <li>• Via signage, set clear guidance for use of toilets to ensure social distancing is achieved as much as possible, ie one individual/family group in - one out; limit queues to two people - volunteers will monitor use of toilets to this effect.</li> <li>• Via signage, set clear cleaning guidance for toilets by individual users, ie clean toilet seat with anti-bacterial spray after use.</li> <li>• Each toilet facility will be wiped down before and after the session with antibacterial spray.</li> <li>• Make all washrooms unisex to minimise queuing with baby change facilities available in all washrooms</li> </ul>	Jan-21
Use of Emmanuel Baptist Church for mid-week baby and expectant mums support group	Covid-19 entering the premises and potentially infecting users of the building	If Covid-19 is contracted visitors, staff or volunteers could become ill	Volunteers/Staff/Adult Visitors (Children)	Medium(Children are Low risk)	Yes	Clean building thoroughly once per week and between events.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensure church building is deep cleaned every week by professional cleaners.</li> <li>• Before and after New and Expectant Mums Support Group clean Emmanuel's main toilet facilities as follows: sinks and toilet seats, toilet handles and door handles will be cleaned with antibacterial spray/wipes to prevent cross contamination from previous usage.</li> <li>• Before and after New and Expectant Mums Support Group clean door handles and light switches in the Side Hall with antibacterial spray or wipes.</li> <li>• Chairs will be moved by staff/volunteers wearing disposable gloves. Any small children's chairs that are used will be quarantined in the Old Creche Room for 72 hours.</li> <li>• Remove and quarantine toys used during New and Expectant Mums Support Group in storage space for 72 hours.</li> <li>• Lock/close all doors to rooms in building that aren't in use, ie kitchen, MP Room, Main Hall to avoid need for cleaning.</li> </ul>	Jan-21
Use of Emmanuel Baptist Church for mid-week baby and expectant mums support group			Volunteers/Staff/Adult Visitors (Children)	Medium(Children are Low risk)		Keep key surfaces clean and reduce number of frequently touched surfaces.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Supply antibacterial wipes and sprays to regularly clean surfaces before and after each session, eg: chairs, tables, door handles, light switches.</li> <li>• Wedge open access doors to Side Hall and corridors during the session to avoid multiple touching of door handles/plates.</li> <li>• Ask visitors to bring own refreshments for child(ren).</li> <li>• Encourage visitors to bring their own beverage.</li> <li>• Ask everyone (via signage) not to handle leaflets unless they are going to take home.</li> <li>• Volunteers monitor the use of door handles and clean during the session as appropriate.</li> </ul>	Jan-21

Use of Emmanuel Baptist Church for mid-week baby and expectant mums support group	Covid-19 entering the premises and potentially infecting users of the building	If Covid-19 is contracted visitors, staff or volunteers could become ill	Volunteers/Staff/Adult Visitors (Children)	Medium(Children are Low)	Yes	<p>Ensure face coverings are worn at all times in the church building during the session, except those who are exempt or when it is reasonable to do so.</p> <p>A face covering is defined as 'something which safely covers the nose and mouth' and includes the following: face mask, fabric covering, bandana. Volunteers should <b>not</b> challenge an individual who is not wearing a face covering, but should assume that they are exempt.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Signs will remind adults that a face covering should be worn indoors unless they are exempt.</li> <li>• A face covering must be worn at all times by all attendees in the church building during the session, except those persons who are exempt or when it is reasonable to remove it.</li> <li>• Ensure clear signage in foyer re. face covering requirement.</li> </ul>	Jan-21
