Emmanuel Baptist Church Suitability Policy

Purpose

This policy has been written to explain how Emmanuel will be fair and lawful in taking account of past convictions/cautions when conducting recruitment and selection procedures of staff. It is a requirement under the Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) codes of practice

Policy.

- 1. When recruiting and selecting members of staff (including volunteers), Emmanuel does not regard the fact that an individual has criminal convictions/cautions, whether live or spent, as an automatic bar to working for us.
- 2. A central tenet of our faith recognises that individuals who truly repent of personal wrongdoing can receive personal forgiveness in their relationship with God.
- 3. Whilst acknowledging this, we also recognise that a person's past convictions/cautions may have a bearing on their suitability for particular roles in the church (see also point 5 below).
- 4. We would approach each circumstance as an individual case and seek to act in a fair and transparent way
- 5. All remunerated posts in the church and the majority of voluntary roles involve direct work with either children or vulnerable adults and are roles where a level of trust is required.
- 6. DBS checks of paid and voluntary posts are therefore undertaken by a member of the Safeguarding Committee to the appropriate degree required (standard or enhanced) for each role.
- 7. Emmanuel recognises the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act and that certain convictions/cautions are regarded as legally "spent" after specified periods of time.
- 8. We do not require applicants to disclose spent convictions as they would be disregarded in our recruitment/selection process. Please note: A DBS check for a particular role will only disclose relevant and not spent convictions.
- 9. If we considered that a past conviction/caution was a reason why a person should be disqualified from performing a role in the church, we would discuss this in person with them, and seek to be fair in responding to any complaints they may have.
